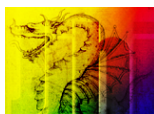

WE are happy to present to our readers the third number of the *Journal of Interdisciplinary History of Ideas*, enriched by new collaborations and by a welcome opening to the history of law.

But, beyond the pride that goes with this result, and with our endurance, we also feel the necessity for us to get a wider perspective. We should like to be, in a good sense, ‘networkers’: to foster our *Journal*, our work, and the field of studies—interdisciplinary history of ideas—that we keep promoting; and for new collaborations to open up. So we are taking two new initiatives.
