

## **ARTICLE TITLE**

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### **Abstract**

The text must be 200 words maximum, Times New Roman 12, single line spacing, justified text. The abstract must be in Italian and in another language among English, French, Portuguese and Spanish (200 words in Italian and 200 words in another chosen language).

### **Keywords**

List maximum five keywords separated by comma.

### **Main level heading Title**

*Second level heading title*

The text must be 5.000 words maximum, Times New Roman 12, 1,5 line spacing, justified text. Manuscripts can be submitted in Italian, English, French, Portuguese, Spanish. Divide the text of the article in paragraphs and subparagraphs using the font format reported in this text.

### **Tables and Figures**

Every table and image must report number and title in progressive order with single arabic numerals. Ex. Table (or Tab.) 1 – Table title ; Figure 1 – Figure Title.

References to Tables and Figures must be inserted in the text. Tables and Figures must be inserted in the order in which they are mentioned in the text, if possible at the top of the page and as close as possible to the quote.

Tables and Figures should not replicate data and information already provided in the text of the article.

### **Notes**

Notes must be inserted in the footer, with progressive numbering in Roman numeral, Times New Roman 11, single line spacing.

To facilitate the reading it is recommended to limit the use of notes and their length (only few lines per note).

### **Acronyms**

Abbreviations and acronyms must be inserted in-text in the text the first time they are appointed. Ex: Coordinamento Universitario per la Cooperazione allo Sviluppo (Cucs). It must be provided a annex with a list of acronyms used in the text.

## Quotes and Citation

In case of citations of other publications or interviews made by the authors that exceed a line of length, it is recommended to put the text in Times New Roman, font 12, single line spacing with indentation as shown in the following example:

## Acknowledgements

Insert eventual acknowledgements at the end of the article before the bibliography.

## Bibliography

Publications mentioned in the article must be indicated in the text in brackets with last name of the author and year of publication, for example (Amin 1989), and subsequently they must be listed at the end of the paper in the following way:

## **List of acronyms**

Insert acronyms and full name in alphabetical order in a two-columns table without edges as in the example:

Abc	Acqua Bene Comune
Cucs	Coordinamento Università per la Cooperazione allo Sviluppo

## **Use of capital letters**

Abbreviations must be made according to pattern High/low if more than 2 letters: ex. Cucs, not CUCS; Fao, not FAO, UN, not Un, US, not Us, Undp, not Undp
